At last some warm, sunny weather has facilitated different play outside with tulips and daffodils popping up all over the place. This week we have noticed our seeds we planted are growing even more. The children have commented on the changes noticing their stems are

taller and the leaves are getting bigger.

In group time we have been thinking about different jobs that adults do and how some of them help us when we need it. The children used their problem solving skills to work out who would be the best person to help in different scenarios.

On Tuesday we were very lucky to have a visit from James the Paramedic (Betsy's dad). He told us some of the ways he helps people if they get hurt. The children



explored some of the equipment he uses, listening to their hearts using the stethoscope and looking in their mouths with the special torch. We tried on his safety jacket and helmet - it was so heavy!

We will be having a visit by a doctor later in the week.


makers, sculptors, tinkerers, engineers and architects of tomorrow!
