

Friday 24th May Break up for half term holidays.



We hope you have a lovely Easter break




Book recommendation of the month

"The world is full of people of different races. This is what makes the world so fun and interesting."



We have been reading this book at Nursery alongside our Personna doll, Biba's visits. It is a powerful book to help young children to begin to have meaningful discussions about race. It also explores how important it is for children to celebrate their achievements and greatness.



The book is written for children aged 4 upwards but we have been reading parts of it with all our children and they are really enjoying it, as well as gaining essential understanding from it.

We have also been focussing on how we are all different and unique. We have been comparing skin, eye and hair colour to celebrate our differences while understanding that we are all human. Another GREAT book we have used—and perfect for this age group is 'My Body, Your Body, Skin.' It is part of a series of 6 books.

Speech Technique of the Month Have conversations

Making comments instead of asking questions will encourage your child to respond.

Pause between sentences to give your child time to process information.

Young children find it easier to talk about something they are looking at or doing.
