It's hard to believe that we are rapidly approaching the Christmas break - this term has flown by.




The children have been working towards their woodwork curriculum goal and have been introduced to small hammers and golf tees as nails. They have learnt how to use them safely at the woodwork bench as they hammer them into a pumpkin. This prior learning will help them to manipulate the larger hammers and

real nails on wood as a next step.

We have introduced a story telling tool called 'Tales Toolkit' to the children this week. The resources consist of bags bearing the symbols for 'character, setting, problem and resolution.' Inside the bags are various props that the children use to collaboratively structure and tell their own story. They are

On Wednesday the theatre group 'Hobgoblin' came to nursery to perform 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' for the children. They all sat transfixed to the familiar tale and found it very funny! The performers were skillful at engaging the children in a workshop afterwards where they explored good and bad

characters, scary and happy forests, problems and solutions. We were so proud of the listening and attention skills they displayed as well as their confidence to suggest solutions and talk about the different characters in the story.




The children would love to share the Christmas songs they've been learning with their parents and carers. This will take place on

Speech Technique of the Month

Have conversations

Making comments instead of asking questions will encourage your child to respond - 4 comments to every question.

Pause between sentences to give your child time to process information. Give them 10 seconds at least to respond.

Young children find it easier to talk about something they are looking at or doing.

Friday 5th January - Term Starts - Children return.


Monday 8th January - New children begin this week. (Please note the new children will have staggered start times)

It is also important that parents/ carers complete all the choices when completing the form as this has an impact whether you are able to join a waiting list should you not be given your preferred choice.


Christmas Hamper Raffle!
