#### **Speech Technique of the Month**

#### Have conversations

Making comments instead of asking questions will encourage your child to respond – 4 comments to every question.

Pause between sentences to give your child time to process information. Give them 10 seconds at least to respond.

Young children find it easier to talk about something they are looking at or doing.
