

Our Learning



This week - 8th -12th January

What a busy week of fun with our new friends and even some snow! The new children have settled in well and it has been lovely to see the children welcome them and support them to follow our rules and routines, playing and learning together. We were treated to beautiful blue skies and bright sunshine but very cold weather. It made us think about what we needed, to be ready, to go outside and enabled us to develop our independent skills as we put on our coats, gloves and hats to wrap up warm. *Please make sure in this cold weather that children come to nursery with warm coats and hats.*

Inspired by our focus artists, James Brunt and Andy Goldsworthy, we created some transient art and next week there will be a transient art area for the children to continue their creativity in free flow play.

The children showed fantastic understanding of repeated pattern as it was introduced this week. Pattern is a mathematical concept where something is arranged in a particular way and creates the foundations of later mathematical thinking and reasoning. As they made their patterns children described it out loud, "stick, conker, stick, conker".

Next week – 15th – 19th January
