The Children's Learning

The children have been very busy this month and have been learning all about hearts. We made some lovely heart pictures, using paint and washing up liquid to create amazing bubble hearts.

One of the children at nursery had a fantastic idea and was using his broom to clean our windows in the garden. We had a discussion about the tools we need to clean and together we found a bucket and filled it with some soapy water, collected some sponges and began cleaning the windows at nursery. Potty/Toilet Training

Many parents ask us about potty training. Once you feel that your child is *ready* for potty/toilet training and *the time is right*, we will be very happy to support this at Nursery.



- Speak to your key person so we can work together;
- Ensure that your child is settled at Nursery and there are no other changes such as a house move or new baby etc;
- Read books about toilet training or use older siblings/peers as positive role models;
- **Don't use 'pull-ups'** children need to experience being wet/dirty in order to understand and learn from 'accidents'. Pull-ups feel like nappies so they often confuse children and delay the toilet training process mistakes are how we learn!;
- Have a good supply of pants/knickers at all times;
- Ensure your child is dressed in clothing that can easily be pulled down in a hurry (no tight clothes, jeans or dungarees) tracksuit bottoms are perfect;
- No reprimanding for accidents as this will make the process stressful and may lead to more accidents!
