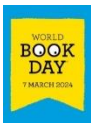


This week – 26th February – 1st March

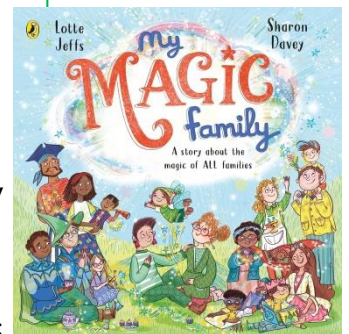
