able to go on our Spring walks at group time in the beautiful grounds of Oakfield School where we can spot more signs of Spring.




Our focused story at the moment is 'The Three Little Pigs'. The children always love exploring this traditional tale and thinking of their own solutions for the wolf!

This week we have been recording our own interpretations of the story through mark-making and each child has been confident to have a go.



In the garden the children are exploring building houses of their own made from different materials such as wooden blocks and crates, then using them as a setting to act out the story.

I think I'm going to make an aeroplane with my playdough


That's a big tower!

Polite Reminders

-  Please bring in a healthy snack for children to share every now and then e.g. pack of apples, bananas, pears, strawberries, breadsticks, rice cakes etc.
