Our Learning

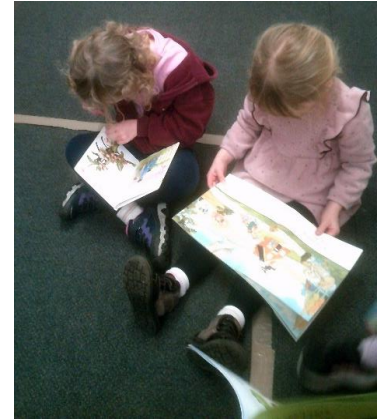

This week we have been exploring and celebrating books as part of World Book Day. The children have been sharing and discussing their favourite books with their friends. In Group Time we have been exploring all the parts of a book, such as the title, the blurb and author.

We have been continuing to learn about recycling, sorting items into the right place and discussing the various materials – paper, plastic, glass, tin, food – and where they should go.

The children have been continuing to use the 'Tinker Tray' this week, learning the names of the various pieces such as nuts and bolts and how to use them.

We have been reading the book 'The Shrinking Mouse' this week and discussing perspectives, as part of our spatial awareness learning. The children took part in an investigation in the garden, they were able to see that their friends looked smaller when they were further away in the garden and they got bigger the closer they were to us.



Next Week

We are going to be discussing the changing seasons and noticing the signs of Spring! The children will be encouraged to think back to what the Nursery garden looked like a few weeks ago, and think about how it has changed. We will also look at a variety of non-fiction books about seasons and Spring.

As part of our Climate Action Plan, we will continue to build our knowledge of recycling. Our aim is for all our children to think about what to do when we have finished with something, to reduce our waste, re-use it in some way or recycle it correctly.

The children will be learning about the brain, looking at a diagram of what our brains look like. They will be introduced to the idea that there are three parts of the brain that help us– the prefrontal cortex (wise owl), the Amygdala (guard dog) and the hippocampus (hippo).



At home

Point out and show your child the various items and materials that you are recycling. Maybe they can help you look at the item's packaging to see if it has the recycling logo on it. If you have any soft plastics, you could take these to your local supermarket with your child and put them into the soft plastics recycling bins together.
